GARDENING NOTES FOR JUNE

The days are now lengthening and becoming warmer, so now is the time for bedding plants to be moved out of doors. If the month remains dry it is important to try to keep the plants moist and not to let them flag as this can cause a set - back in growth.

Roses will be coming into full bloom during the month of June, so feed them well and keep dead heading to encourage small flowers. This is the time to sow sweet William's and wall flowers out doors.

During the month continue successional sowing's of lettuce, radish, beetroot and french beans. A mulch for soft fruits such as raspberries can be applied and foliar feed at this time of year can also be an advantage.

As ever remember to keep the hoe going.
